



A Lesson for Thomas





The Bible tells us in John 20:24-29 about Thomas, who was a follower of Jesus. Thomas didn't believe that Jesus had risen from the dead, even when he heard it from the other disciples! He said ""Unless I see the nail holes in His hands, put my finger in the nail holes, and stick my hand in His side, I won't believe it." Eight days later, Jesus shows up and tells Thomas to put his finger in His wounds, Jesus speaks these powerful words to Thomas, "Stop doubting and believe".

This weeks craft is a paper hands pop-up of Jesus' hands with a piece of scripture that your little makers can weave through Jesus' wounds. We hope this craft serves as a powerful lesson that just because you can't see something with your eyes, doesn't mean it is not real.
