Pastor White holds membership in the <u>National Baptist Convention</u>, <u>USA</u>, <u>Inc.</u>; <u>Baptist General Convention of Virginia</u>; <u>National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP)</u>; and Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc. He is a former State President of the Baptist General Convention of Virginia and former Moderator of the Northern Virginia Baptist Association. Pastor White also serves on the Board of Directors for <u>Virginia One Church One Child</u>, Inc. and the Fairfax County Clergy and Leadership Council. He has completed training as a Community Chaplain for the Fairfax County Office of Emergency Management. Dr. White is also a member of the Pride of Fairfax County Lodge #298 Free and Accepted Masons Inc.

Dr. White is married to the former Ms. Jaffee Ferree and they have two daughters, Sierra (Philip) Ashe and Nia. They are the proud grandparents of two wonderful granddaughters, Jordyn Renee and Malia Naomi Ashe.

Part I: Pandemic to Power, Trauma and Triumph

Response to the Health Crisis and Impact of COVID-19

Bethlehem Baptist Church (BBC) was established in 1863 in the historic Gum Springs Community that includes the Route One Corridor of Fairfax County Virginia's Mount Vernon district. Bethlehem's five-acre campus consists of its Main Campus and East Campus facilities, including a parsonage that was converted into office and meeting spaces for the local Boy Scout Troop 1906 and the Safe Harbor Christian Counseling. The Church's 19,339 square foot main facility where the Sanctuary and the Jaffee Ferree White Fellowship Center (Multi-Purpose Room) is located remains open throughout the pandemic and continue providing space for worship services, funerals, weddings and community outreach programs.

The Reverend Dr. Darrell K. White serves as Bethlehem's Senior Pastor. Bethlehem's congregation is predominately Black with over eight hundred (800) congregants including members, repeat worshippers and their families who attended services regularly prior to the pandemic.

The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) and Prevention urged a nationwide halt to gatherings of more than 50 people, citing the risk of the coronavirus and on Sunday, March 15, 2020 Governor Ralph Northam announced a ban on all gatherings of 100 people or more statewide amid a rise in coronavirus cases in Virginia. Accordingly, BBC cancelled in-person worship services; worship and ministry activities were moved to being handled virtually and the staff was given remote access in order to conduct business in a virtual environment. Under the direction of the Pastor, the Trustees and BBC leadership team immediately developed a contingency plan for adherence to the federal, state and local authorities' mandates for the Faith Community and Houses of Worship. Additionally, steps were taken to ensure safe work conditions for essential employees.

Recognized by the community and its partners as a "safe" place as well as a coordinated meeting site, prior to the pandemic Bethlehem routinely hosted outside organizations along with residents to engage them in conversations that impact the community at large. Additionally, an intricate part of Bethlehem's Missions ministry operations includes community outreach and it has been and continues to be a coordinated site helping to decrease food insecurities for the Gum Springs and Route One Corridor communities for decades. Partnering with local organizations such as the Capital Area Food Bank, Save A Truck (nonprofit food truck) and World Central Kitchen, the BBC Missions Ministry continues providing outreach and direct services to the residents during the COVID-19 pandemic. The impact of the weekly food distribution program resulted in Bethlehem providing produce and canned goods to feed anywhere from 150 to 250 families weekly, a substantial increase from pre-pandemic levels.

The Gum Springs and Route One Corridor (South County) areas served by Bethlehem include the Black community as well as other communities of color (African American, Latin-X, West African, Asian) and are among Fairfax County's most vulnerable and underserved populations. There's a disproportionate number of transients, including those with limited English proficiency, and those living at the margins of our economy. Statistically, the Virginia zip codes 22306, 22307 and 22309 have the highest rate of unvaccinated residents in the County concerning COVID-19. Bethlehem has a very diverse congregation, however over half of those regularly attending are aged 65 or older who live in the surrounding community and many have chronic health conditions. In response, Bethlehem has been intentional in promoting campaigns to stop the spread of the disease and get at risk populations vaccinated, recently adding children to the list of high risk and among the least vaccinated in the population.

A consistent pattern continues with South County and communities of these racial and ethnic minority groups having substantially lower vaccination rates in relation to their share of the population and their overrepresentation among COVID-19 infections and deaths. As a Faith Community in one of the most diverse areas of Fairfax County, Bethlehem is committed to ensuring that Health Equity exists for all through its creation and implementation of onsite COVID-19 vaccination clinics. Bethlehem partners with the Virginia Department of Health (VDH), Fairfax County Health Department (FCHD), and Neighborhood Health Clinics (NH) to distribute COVID-19 vaccines in an effort to Address Disparities in COVID-19 Vaccination Rates and Outcomes Among US Black and Latino Populations. Bethlehem hosted COVID-19 vaccination clinics onsite and will continue serving the community in this manner to promote health equity. To date, the impact of our efforts to reduce the spread of COVID-19 resulted in the Health Ministry registering and successfully getting over 2500 people vaccinated and/or boosted so far.

Part 2: The Path to Recovery Impact on the Black Family, Church and Community

According to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, "community health resilience is the ability of a community to use its assets to strengthen public health and healthcare systems and to improve the community's physical, behavioral, and social health to withstand, adapt to, and recover from adversity." In a letter dated February 13, 2021, the Voices of Black Fairfax notified churches in the Northern Virginia Baptist Association that the Fairfax County Health Department wanted their help in trying to reach the African American community to distribute the Covid-19 vaccinations to our members 75 and older and those with underlying conditions. The County's urgency had been prompted by the disparity of the distribution of the vaccination to African American and other communities of color. The efforts to include Houses of Worship to address the inequities surrounding access to healthcare, specifically communities of color put forth by the Voices of Black Fairfax were instrumental to BBC's ability to stand up COVID Vaccination clinics. Additionally, BBC was able to take advantage of other opportunities to fight the inequities exposed by the pandemic made a available to Houses of Worship by the Federal Emergency Management Agency and the Virginia Health Department through its Virginia Partners in Prayer & Prevention (P3) Disparities Grant program and various other local organizations.

BBC's Health and Stewardship Ministries, as a part of the P3 grant created a work-plan to provide a stabilization program to enhance community resiliency and health equity in the aftermath of the COVID-19 pandemic, include:

- Recruit staff and volunteers to engage in navigation, outreach & education via Phone Banks, Flyers, and all forms of Media and Social Media
- Provide staff/volunteers to register, navigate & support residents with health and COVID-19 related needs.
- Social media campaigns debunking false information; practicing safe hygiene, masking and social distancing
- Health Literacy and Host outreach by distributing flyers (detailed information of vaccination locations & dates) and getting contact information for vaccine and education follow-up.
- Health education and Preventive care and disease management
- Addressing mistrust or hesitancy within the African-American, Hispanic/ Latinx and Homeless populations in the church and community.
